Winter Warmers

Sweet potato soup with goats cheese and pinenuts

Ingredients

• 600g orange sweet potato, peeled and cut into 3cm cubes



6 cups salt
 reduced chicken or vegetable stock

- 1 onion, chopped roughly
- ½ teaspoon finely grated ginger
- 1 long red chilli, seeded and finely chopped
- 50g raw pine nuts
- 100g goats cheese, roughly crumbled
- 1 tablespoon baby basil leaves, to serve
- 6 slices bread, to serve

1 Method

- 1. Place the sweet potato, onion, ginger, chilli and stock in a large saucepan over medium heat.
- 2. Bring to the boil reduce the heat and simmer for 20 minutes or until sweet potato is soft.
- 3. Remove from heat and cool.
- 4. While the soup is cooling heat a small saucepan over low heat.
- 5. Add the pinenuts and cook until golden. Remove from the heat and set aside.
- 6. Once cooled slightly process the soup in batches in a food processor or blender and return to the pan.
- 7. Heat again then divide between bowls and top with goats cheese basil leaves and pine nuts.
- 8. Serve with dark rye bread.





Book Review Rocky River 'Riters

The English Patient by Michael Ondaatje

The story is set in 1945 with Germans retreating. World War 2 has just ended and the story starts with Hana, a young nurse, gardening outside a villa in Italy in 1945. The Germans are retreating throughout the Italian countryside, the nurses and patients have left the villa to escape to a safer place with Hana deciding to stay in the villa with



the last patient. Hana knows little of the patient and assumes that he is English through her observing his mannerisms.


This intriguing story weaves through four different characters, Hana the nurse, Kip the Indian Sapper, Caravaggio the thief and the English patient, who has no name or identity, all of whom are wounded in different ways. Little by little the English patient tells his story. Is there a possibility that he is not English after all? Each character is intertwined with his story which links them from the past to the present.

This Booker prize-winning book explores World War 2 from a different perspective and with the use of characters who have hidden backgrounds, the book successfully delves into personalities and personal issues drawing the reader into the tale.

Well worth a read. This novel was adapted to film in 1996 and is considered in the Top 50 'Book-to-Movie' adaptations.
