
About this Plan

We want to follow our values in everything we do. Our values will show:








- accessible and quality services

- We will reduce lead exposure in the community.

New and improving infrastructure will improve our tourism and hospitality services.

Education and Jobs



Our goal is to have a workforce that can change, grow and respond to different situations, challenges and opportunities.

Our projects are to:

- increase the opportunities from the Federal Government's Employment Facilitator
- deliver projects that increase work
- make sure child care options are available



- We will use the State and Federal Governments partner to support employment opportunities.

- start Stage 1 of the Southern Flinders Rangers National Park and look at projects for stage 2

- plan and start the next stage of Flinders Industrial Estate

Our strategies are:




• We will support local businesses to grow.

Project

Built Environment



Project

Our goal is to value, celebrate and improve our cultural and built **heritage** with new developments.

Heritage means things that are part of our history, they have been there for a long time.

Our projects are to:

- review the Council's Development Plan and start the new Planning and Design Code
- create and start the Riverbank Precinct Masterplan
- create and start the Memorial Park Masterplan

Our strategies are:

• We will have opportunities for social, residential, retail, commercial and industrial activity and growth.



• We will find, protect and promote our unique areas and sites.



• We will make our public spaces inspiring, exciting and welcoming to encourage social interaction and activity.







Our goal is to look after our **infrastructure** and make sure it meets the current and future needs.

Infrastructure means the buildings, roads, power and other facilities that are built.

Our projects are to:

- improve our footpaths and make new walking and bicycle paths
- check our council buildings and think about their future
- increase the use of the Port of Pirie
- encourage use of the Port Pirie Airport
- better look after unsealed roads to make them more accessible and seal more roads
- prioritise upgrades to roads for heavy vehicle access

- We will make sure our roads can be used for walking, cycling and vehicles.
- We will prioritise regional transport networks to support use.
- We will look at our assets to make sure they are looked after and ready for use.
- We will make sure our facilities are used and support economic change.









Sustainability



Project

Our goal is to think about sustainability during our planning and decisions.

Our projects are to:

- find a way to increase our water supply and use the water in a less wasteful way
- create a Variable Climate Policy
- look at how to separate food and garden organics from other waste
- reduce our waste to landfill
- look into a community level virtual power plant

- We will reduce the amount of water we use and increase our water supply.
- We will change and reduce the impact of a changing climate.
- We will work to improve our waste and resources to become a Green Industrial City.
- We will think about the environment during energy making and its use.







Natural Environment



Our goal is to look after our natural environment and make it part of the experience of our area.

Project

Our projects are to:

- protect the environment and built history with the Bowman Park Management Plan
- check and use the Native Vegetation Management Plan for activities

- We will look after our natural landscapes and make them an attraction for guests.
- We will support, enjoy and look after our coastal assets.

We want to work with our community, service providers, the State Government, and the Federal Government.

Partnerships






Our goal is to have strong partnerships to develop parts of this Community Plan.


