

Are you eSmart?


Being eSmart means knowing how to guard against security and privacy risks online, downloading content in a legal and ethical way, and managing reputation and relationships in cyberspace.

and now a book that is easy to read and with many simple suggestions.


I've also just read *The gardener's year: enjoy your Australia garden season by season.* The book is full of beautiful photographs, each effectively illustrating a point made in the text.


