NYE FIREWORKS WATER RESTRICTIONS

Please be advised of the following restrictions taking place on Monday 31st December:

- -The John Pirie Bridge will be **CLOSED** from **8am** 3lst December 2018 to **2am** 1st January 2019.
- -NO boats can be launched or in the water (excluding long term moored boats) within 400m of the John Pirie Bridge aka Bridge to nowhere during the following times:
- **8.45pm to 10.15pm** for 9.30pm fireworks display
- II.I5pm to I2.45am for Midnight display
- NO boats may launch or retrieve at the Solomontown Boat Ramp from 12pm 3lst December 2017 to 2am lst January 2018
- *These restrictions have been implemented due to safety as the fireworks which will be launched off the bridge at 9.30pm and Midnight.
- * **Port Pirie SES** will be monitoring the water during specified periods to ensure no boats are in the water. For any enquiries please contact 0467 683 333


