





Book Review

Burial rites by Hannah Kent

Based on true events in Iceland, Hannah Kent's novel takes the reader into the hearts and minds of the people involved in this distressing event. The woman at the centre of the story is Agnes Magnúsdóttir who, with two others, is convicted of murder and sentenced to be executed by beheading. The action of the story takes place during the final months before the execution when Agnes is placed in the unwilling custody of the District Officer Jon Jonsson and his family.



Against the backdrop of the harsh and forbidding Icelandic countryside and the daily struggle for existence, the family and the young priest Reverend Thorvador (Toti), who has been appointed her spiritual advisor, come to accept Agnes as she is, although any interaction is constantly clouded by the crime of which she is convicted and her impending death.

The story, told by a narrator and through the introspections of Agnes and Toti her priest, is universal in its portrayal of the basic human emotions and relationships when dealing with love, hate, fear, betrayal and physical endurance against an unforgiving environment. (C Raison)
