Message from the Mayor

In November 2022, local Elections were conducted to which over 40% of votes were declared. I'm privileged to again be Port Pirie Regional Council's Mayor for another four-year term. As a Chamber, we continue to be committed to our Community.

Within the last financial year, we conducted 12 community consultations. This included a free community event to unveil the detailed designed for Stage 1 of the Port Pirie Riverbank Precinct.

We welcomed back New Years Eve celebrations. Furthermore, we hosted the inaugural Port Pirie Winter Festival with great success - so much so, please save the date for 4-5 August 2023 for this year's Festival.

Port Pirie was a shortlisted for SA Top Tourism Town, and Crystal Brook a finalist for Agricultural Town of the Year - a great achievement for everyone who contributed. We engaged Sports Marketing Australia to assist in attracting events to our region to continue promoting economic development.

We are continuing to improve disability inclusion access to public buildings and amenities. We're participating in the Paint Pirie REaD initiative to encourage child literacy and the library is offering further programs such as a Coding Club. Moreover, Council is entering the second-year of funding for the Greening Port Pirie program with financial support of the State Government and TLAP.

With ongoing rising costs, we made a commitment to ensure rates were less than CPI. We've upheld this commitment and continue to search for initiatives and grants to assist with keeping rates low. We've completed the transition of public road lighting to LED, which has seen our energy consumption decrease by 50% year on year.

We're excited about implementing Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) - thanks to the financial support from SA Government. Further education will come about how and when is this is implemented.

Last, but not least - happy 30 year anniversary to our Visitors Information Centre in May 2024 (and 25 years for Shakka!)

Rates

Council has adopted Capital Valuations, as provided by the Valuer-General, as the basis to raise the annual rates. The rating structure includes various components which make up the rates payable, depending on the locality and land use of the property.

Fixed Charge + (Capital Valuation x differential rate in dollar) + Waste Management Service Charge + CWMS Service Charge (if applicable) + Regional Landscape Levy = Total Rates Payable

The average residential rate will rise by \$96 to \$1,445 which is an increase of 7.6% or \$1.85 per week. Rate increase was less than annual CPI inflation to the Marchquarter 2023, Adelaide, all groups.

Rates may be paid by quarterly instalments due on 13 September 2023, 13 December 2023, 13 March 2024, with final payment required by 12 June 2024.

Details on rates calculations, concessions and valuations are provided on the reverse side of the rates notice.


