## YOUR BIN COLLECTION SCHEDULE IS CHANGING

Port Pirie Regional Council is introducing food waste recycling to all residents.

From **4 March 2024** your kerbside bin collection service is changing. This will include:

> Green-lid food organics and garden organics (FOGO) bin **COLLECTED** WEEKLY

Yellow-lid comingled recycling bin COLLECTED FORTNIGHTLY



Red-lid landfill bin COLLECTED FORTNIGHTLY



## WHAT IS FOGO?

FOGO stands for 'Food Organics and Garden Organics' and it is the green-lid bin at home.

Anything that grows or once grew belongs in the green-lid FOGO bin, mostly importantly food!

This includes:

- all food waste (including meat, fish, bones, dairy/eggs, fruit, vegetables, and bread),
- soiled paper products (shredded paper, paper towel, tissues, and pizza boxes),
- Australian certified compostable packaging (AS4736 or AS5810),
- all garden organics (e.g. prunings and grass clippings).

Material placed in the green-lid FOGO bin is collected and taken to Peats where it is turned into compost.

## WHY WEEKLY FOGO?

Introducing weekly FOGO and changing to fortnightly landfill collections has significant benefits.

This includes:

- Increasing food recycling rates.
- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions by stopping food going to landfill.
- Households have more bin capacity each fortnight.
- Reducing smell from the green FOGO bins, by collecting food and garden organics every week.
- Helping to grow the circular economy by turning FOGO into compost to help grow our food.

## NEED MORE CAPACITY?

Contact council if you need more bin capacity. Additional landfill or recycling bins are available to purchase.



# WHAT IS IN THE LANDFILL BIN?

Recent audits found nearly one third of what is in the landfill bin can be recycled in the yellow-lid recycling or green-lid FOGO bin. Sorting and recycling this material will give you more space in your fortnightly landfill bin.

17% recyclables 44% compostables 39% landfill

## **BIN CAPACITY**

Changing to weekly FOGO means you actually have more bin capacity. Correctly sorting material into the correct bin will help to manage less frequent landfill collections. You might be surprised that there isn't much left to put in the red-lid bin!







### COMPOSTABLE BAGS

Compostable bags are made of plant starch instead of oil. This means they break down in the composting process.

Only certified compostable bags with the logo should be placed in the FOGO bin. Never use plastic bags.

### NEED MORE COMPOSTABLE BAGS?

You can purchase additional rolls of compostable bags from council if you run out.

Rolls of compostable bags are also available at local supermarkets.

The bags in the fresh fruit and vegetable section of Woolworths are also compostable. You can reuse these in your caddy to collect and recycle your food scraps.

## USING YOUR KITCHEN CADDY It's easy to collect food scraps



Line the caddy with a compostable bag. Bags must be labelled Compostable AS 4736 and/or Home Compostable AS 5810.



You can also line your kitchen caddy with newspaper.



After 2-3 days, or when the caddy is full, place the collected foodscraps in your green FOGO bin.

## TIPS

- A tight-fitting lid on your green organics bin will help keep flies and pests away.
- Place lawn clippings, leaves or shredded paper on food scraps to absorb moisture and reduce odours.
- Freeze scraps like seafood and meat until your collection day.
- All food scraps can be placed loose, or in compostable bags into your green FOGO bin.



## NAPPIES AND OTHER HYGIENE PRODUCTS NEVER GO IN THE GREEN FOGO BIN

## **TIPS** for disposing of nappies and other hygiene products

Nappies and other hygiene products can't be recycled and must be placed in your landfill bin. The fortnightly collection shouldn't affect bin odour.

A nappy trial undertaken by Lake Macquarie City Council found that:

- the number of nappies in the landfill bin did not have a significant effect on the odour
- the average odour of a landfill bin with nappy waste was similar after a fortnight as it was after a week.

## **TIPS** if you are worried about the smell

- Dispose of as much solid waste as possible into the toilet, before placing the nappy in the landfill bin.
- Wrap dirty nappies tightly in a nappy bag.
- Store your landfill bin in the shade.
- Keep your bin lid closed tightly.
- Place a small amount of odour control agent in the bottom of your bin to repel flies and odours. Use natural products like vinegar, eucalyptus and mint oils or crystals.
- Try cloth nappies and or reusable hygiene items.


