

Council Rates: Useful Information

Receive Your Rates Notices By Email!

- → You can receive your rates notices by email. Visit the Ezybill link on Council's website (http://pirie.ezybill.com.au/).
- → Have your rates notice handy when signing up as you will need to provide your reference number.

Payment Amounts & Due Dates

▶ Each rates notice contains the amounts owing for each of the remaining instalments for the financial year and due dates. This is helpful for budgeting and planning.

Responsibility For Payments

- → Did you know it is each property owner's responsibility to ensure payments are made on their property even if a rates notice is not received?
- ▶ Keep track of your rates due dates (as above) and by checking in with family and friends to see if they have received their notice.
- It's also important to ensure your postal address is correct (see below)

Does Council Have Your Correct Postal Address?

- Please contact Council if you have recently purchased a property or moved house to change your postal address.
- ▶ If you haven't received your Council rates notice 3-4 weeks from the due date, please contact Council to confirm your postal address.

Late Payments

- Late fines of 2% of the amount owed are charged on late rates payments.
- → At the end of each month thereafter, interest (at the rate prescribed in the Local Government Act 1999) will be added to any balance outstanding.
- Please contact Council's Rates Officer to arrange a payment plan (see below).

Account Enquiries

→ Please be aware that only persons named on the rates notice can make enquiries on behalf of that property unless you have Power of Attorney or written/verbal permission of Ratepayer to enquire on their behalf.
