
## PORT PIRIE REGIONAL COUNCIL

## Burning Permit Issued Pursuant to Clause 6(3)(a)(2) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016



Note: Should a desire exist for a fire outside of the below conditions, an individual permit is required and MUST be applied for from Council, in advance.

## **Conditions**

- a) Burns only to occur between **10am and 3pm** daily, Monday Saturday inclusive.
- b) Neighbors who are likely to be affected are to be notified prior to light up, so evasive action can be taken to avoid smoke.
- c) Sufficient water at hand to extinguish immediately should necessity arise.
- d) The fire to be supervised by an adult at all times and completely extinguished before it is left.
- e) If asked to extinguish the fire because someone is affected, you must comply.
- f) Only dry timber or timber derivative may be burnt and an accelerant MUST NOT BE USED.
- g) This permit does **NOT** authorise a person to burn on land if the person is not the owner of the land or does not have the consent of the owner or occupier of the land.

## **Notes**

- 1) This generic permit will remain in force for a period of 12 months or until the start date of the 2023/2024 fire danger season, (whichever the sooner).
- 2) This permit does not authorise the burning of any other substance other than dry timber or timber derivatives.
- 3) The fact that a person has complied with the conditions of this permit does not;
  - a) Relieve that person from liability for any loss, damage or harm caused by a fire lit under the authority of the permit; **OR**
  - b) Prevent proceedings for enforcement of the general environmental duty under section 25 of the Environment Protection Act 1993, or for any offence under the Act, in relation to the burning activity, (clause 6(5) of the Environment Protection (Clean Air) Policy 2016.

This permit is subject to any ban, prohibition, restriction or other requirement under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005, the Native Vegetation Act 1991 or a prescribed Act (clause 5(4) of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016.

- 1) B,C,D,E and F as listed above are mandatory
- Any other conditions apply to individual fires are at the discretion of the Authorised Officer.
